

## Town and Country Gun Club Range Rules

1. Lock the gate both on entering and leaving.
2. Do not drive on our neighbors grass/yards when entering or leaving on Gun Club Lane, this is the shared drive from Hwy. 162 to the gate. If you meet another vehicle in this area pull into one of the driveways and allow the other vehicle to pass. Do not pull onto the grass/yards.
3. Only 1 firearm per person on the bench.
4. When red lights are on firearms should be unloaded, actions open and step away from benches.
5. Firearms may be moved 1 bench from your position. Any farther movement requires firearm to be unloaded and cased.
6. You must wear your membership card where it is visible to range officers when on club property. Your membership card is your ticket to the range. If you do not have your card displayed you will be asked to leave the property.
7. Please clean up after yourself before leaving.
8. Use wooden or PVC target stands to hold targets. Minimum height is to be at least 4 feet to insure impact into the backstop.
9. Place tin cans, etc. halfway up the backstop if that is your target of choice.
10. Do not shoot at anything glass.
11. Do not shoot at anything which might cause a ricochet.
12. Do not shoot into the creek.
13. Do not shoot into sun baked or frozen ground, this is just like shooting into concrete, ricochets will happen.
14. No holstered weapons are allowed except when the range is closed for police qualification or during specific authorized competitive shooting events.
15. Shooting times: **8 A.M. to dark Monday – Saturday**  
**9 A.M. to dark on Sunday**
16. Make sure your impact zone is on the backstop. There are houses less than 800 yards down range.
17. Do not throw misfires into the burn barrels, trash cans or grass. Misfires may be dropped into the barrels labeled "**Brass/Misfires**" located on the firing line.
18. Always wear hearing and eye protection both on the firing line and as an observer.
19. No hunting of any kind is allowed anywhere on club property.
20. No shot size larger than #7.5 is allowed on the sheet and trap fields, there are houses just across the creek.
21. Designated red hat range officers are in charge while on duty. Do what they ask or leave and then contact the Executive Committee with your concerns or complaints.
22. Full auto fire is not allowed. The range facilities are inadequate to insure safety for fully automatic weapons.
23. When a cease fire has been called and the range is "**Clear**" or "**Cold**", **put all firearms on the tables with the actions opened before anyone goes downrange.** Turn the red rotating lights "**ON**". No firearms are to be handled at this time while people are downrange.
24. After verifying that all shooters have returned from all downrange areas of the pistol/rifle range, especially from way down at the 200 yard line, the range can now go "**HOT**" and the red rotating lights can be turned "**OFF**", firing can now commence.
25. No .50 caliber center fire BMG is allowed.
26. Alcoholic beverages of any type are not allowed on club property.
